
With this campaign, we mark 25 years since Everybody Dance LA! first brought dance into Los Angeles classrooms.

It began with a child who loved to dance, 13-year-old Gabriella Axelrad, who died in a tragic accident. In her memory, her mother, Liza Bercovici, founded Everybody Dance LA! (EDLA!) — a tribute that has become a movement grounded in equity, creativity, and belonging.

At EDLA! we bring rigorous, low-cost dance into schools and after-school programs across Los Angeles — from pre-K and through high school. Because confidence isn't built in a day. Because creativity grows in community. And because when students move with purpose, the world takes notice.

When our students thrive, their communities are transformed.

We build more than dancers — we cultivate collaborators, communicators, and leaders. Through mentorship, leadership training, and pre-professional opportunities, we prepare young people for more than performance. We prepare them to thrive — and when they do, the impact ripples outward, shaping stronger, more vibrant communities across Los Angeles.

Interview with former EDLA! students Norbert De La Cruz III and Haylie Rivera.

Norbert is a Visiting Assistant Professor of Dance at Point Park University where Haylie is a first-year student pursuing a BFA in Ballet.

How did you first realize that EDLA! was truly making a difference in your life?

Norbert: I was a very quiet kid, and EDLA! helped me come out of my shell. I learned to express myself, and along with that came confidence and a sense of belonging. It was truly transformative.

How has EDLA! connected you with opportunities you might not have otherwise encountered?

Haylie: EDLA! gave me so many opportunities from auditions to scholarships and summer intensives. It was an amazing introduction to the dance world.

Norbert: When I was at EDLA!, Carol Zee encouraged me to apply to Los Angeles High School for the Arts, which is where I graduated from.

Haylie: Ms. Tina meets with all the seniors to talk about

college, and she was the one to point Encouraged me to apply to Point Park University.

What do you hope students and families will experience at EDLA?

Norbert: I think the most important thing EDLA! offers is the opportunity to be your true authentic self, to move in a way that's authentic to you, and create discipline as well.

How would you describe the impact EDLA! has had in your life?

Norbert: I don't think I'd be where I am today without their support. There was never any judgment — only encouragement, compassion, generosity, and care.

Haylie: It's so hard when you leave, but when you come back, it's so rewarding. It's like home.
